


User Guide Manhole Shutters



Product Information **Overview**

The Conquip Manhole Shutters are simple to assemble, pre-formed, steel shutters to assist with pouring of concrete manhole surrounds.


They are designed for use as a temporary shutter when casting a concrete surround around precast concrete manhole rings. Complete with an easy locking mechanism, Conquip Manhole Shutters can be used with concrete manhole ring sizes from 675mm to 2700mm.

Manufactured in the UK from quality British and EU steel.

Important Usage Notes

- Prior to use, ensure that each panel is in good condition and is free from concrete. Also check that each panel has pin and wedge fastenings attached. (There should be 4 of each per panel)
- To transport the shutters only lift using the lifting points. DO NOT attempt to stack one complete shutter on top of another to achieve extra pouring height.
- Only lift the shutters by the lifting points.
- Do not attempt to stack the shutters on top of each other
- to achieve additional pouring height.
- Do not get inside the shutters.

Assembly and Installation Instructions

- 1. Coat the inside faces of the panels with release agent to prevent the concrete from sticking.
- 2. Assemble the shutter with the correct number of panels required.
- 3. Bring the flanges of the panels together and insert a pin through each hole in the flange and then drop a wedge into the slot in each pin.
- 4. Once all pins and wedges are in place, carefully secure the wedges by tapping from above with a hammer.

Assembly Information

Usage Instructions

- 1. Once the Manhole Shutters have been assembled to the required size, it is now ready to use.
- 2. Attach the Manhole Shutters lifting points to the lifting equipment's lifting hooks, using a certified lifting chain sling. Always ensure that the hook's gate is correctly closed and the lifting eye is seated correctly in the hook.
- 3. Check that personnel are clear from the immediate area and the future location to allow for swing of the shutters when lifting off the ground.
- 4. Carefully raise the shutters just off the ground and check for balance.
- 5. Carefully transport the shutters to its required destination.
- 6. Position the shutters over the manhole box and the stacked precast concrete manhole rings, and lower into the excavated trench, so that is surrounds the manhole rings.
- 7. Once in position, release the Manhole Shutters from the lifting equipment.
- 8. The concrete surround can now be cast around the precast manhole rings, within the shutters, by pouring concrete into the gap between the two.
- 9. If a greater pour height is required, this will need to be done in stages- the concrete will need to be poured, set and the excavation backfilled to the new height, before casting the next level.

Extraction

- 1. Once the concrete surround has set, the Manhole Shutters can be removed from the trench.
- 2. Simply reverse the installation process, start by attaching the lifting points to the lifting equipment's lifting hooks, using a certified lifting chain sling.
- 3. Carefully raise the shutters directly vertically from the concrete cast, taking care not to swing the shutters as it comes free from the mould.
- 4. Return to position and release from the lifting equipment.

Original Working Instructions Safety Instructions

Basic Safety

A site-specific Risk Assessment, and lift plan where applicable, must be completed by the responsible person before using this equipment to control risks, produce a safe system of work and ensure safety for you, your colleagues and others. Your risk assessment will determine the correct Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for the task you are doing. You must use it. Conquip recommends that you should wear:

- Suitable clothing
- Gloves
- Hard hat
- Protective footwear (steel toecaps)
- Safety glasses



Important Safety Notes

- Read these instructions before using this equipment. If there is anything you do not understand or if you have any concerns do not use this equipment. Contact your supervisor or Conquip Engineering Group for advice.
- You must check that you have considered all the safety requirements for the task you are doing and that this equipment is suitable.
- You must protect bystanders and the general public by preventing access to the working area.
- Do not use this equipment if you are tired, unwell or under the influence of alcohol or drugs. If you are taking any medicine or undergoing treatment you should inform your supervisor.

Usage & Transportation

- Never unevenly load this equipment.
- The weight of the equipment, together with its attachments, must be added to the weight of the load when calculating the total load that will be imposed on the lifting apparatus / operating machine.
- This equipment must be used in conjunction with the load ratings of the lifting apparatus / operating
 machine. (Refer to the manufacturers' load ratings and original working instructions).
- Make sure you know how to use this equipment and understand all aspects of its operation in case of emergency.
- This equipment weighs more than 25kg. Do not lift or manhandle without machine assistance.
- Do not operate this equipment near overhead power lines.
- Take care in confined spaces, near ceilings or similar hazards. This equipment was designed for vertical lifting. Do not drag, or swing.
- Before operating this equipment, check that you have enough space for you to work safely and make sure that the working area is clear of hazards, obstructions and personnel.
- Before lowering equipment make sure that the landing zone is clear and capable of accepting the size and weight of the load.
- Crush Risk. Keep hands and feet clear of the equipment at all times to avoid injury.
- Do not exceed the maximum Working Load Limit (WLL) shown on the serial plate. Ensure that the WLL
 on the individual lift points is not exceeded.

Personnel

- All personnel must wear relevant personal protective equipment.
- Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery and tie back long hair to avoid becoming tangled or trapped in this equipment. You must make everyone in the work area aware of what you are doing.
- All personnel involved in the lifting operation must be competent to do so and must have been briefed in conjunction with this User Guide available from Conquip Engineering Group, the manufacturer.

Equipment Maintenance & Cleaning

- It is mandatory that the equipment is thoroughly examined regularly, by a qualified engineer, to ensure compliance with relevant regulation/s. (Conquip recommend to carry out thorough examination every six months).
- This product may incorporate various loose and detachable items of lifting gear. Refer to the separate requirements for the safe use of those items.
- When not being used, store the unit in a clean, upright condition and in a safe place where it will be protected from thieves and unauthorised users.
- This equipment must be inspected by the responsible person before each use and then regularly, as
 determined by your risk assessment or working practice. If you have any concerns about condition or
 suitability do not use.
